It is election month. We/You need to elect your Board and general BEC members. About a month ago, I send out a notice to everyone that if they wanted one of the basic board positions (one year positions), they needed to let me (or the Nominating committee) know within 15 days. No one responded which means I expect that those votes will be by a general yes/no group vote. Also up for election are three general voting board member

votes. There are at least four guys who are running for the three open positions. The four guys are, in alphabetical order; Phil Bartels, Harold Minkin, Jim Strange, and Bob Wallace. In an email I asked them to each send me a reply by 8/29 with a few sentences that you guys might want to know, when you are trying to decide their vote. There is a separate segment, just below, regarding their response, if provided. So for election of these board members there is a State corporate policy that gives us guidance. In part it says "Election of the Officers shall be held at the August luncheon meeting(we are a little behind on that, but so it goes). Additional nominations may be made from the floor. A nominee from the floor must signify his agreement to accept the office if elected. Voting shall be by secret ballot, provided that for any office for which there is but one nominee, voting may be by voice or by a show of hands. For three or more nominees for office, the candidate receiving the largest number of votes (a plurality) shall be elected".

So what we are going to do is have one "secret ballot vote" for the three positions. Each voting member writes down three different names. The three highest vote getters are the three new officers. The Big Sir, Little Sir, Secretary & Treasurer will count the votes during the lunch and announce the new board members prior to the end of the meeting.

In order to vote, you must be at the Luncheon. See you all there.




